



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### The Ultimate Guide to Office Renovation

## Signs a Business Needs a Renovation

There's a difference between workspaces that require a few minor updates and those that need a top-to-bottom office renovation. Understanding that difference could save a business thousands of dollars and untold amounts of stress. Below, we'll share four signs that will let business owners know it's time to consider a renovation.

#### **Poor Space Utilization**

Poor space utilization is perhaps the most common sign that it's time for an office renovation. Poor space utilization does not necessarily mean that employees are "crammed in like sardines." Rather, it means that space is not being effectively used — on both a functional and aesthetic level. Poor space utilization can occur in a number of ways. It could be that small offices are not optimized for employee collaboration. Or perhaps a business's layout isn't conducive to quality customer service.

#### **Outdated Appearance**

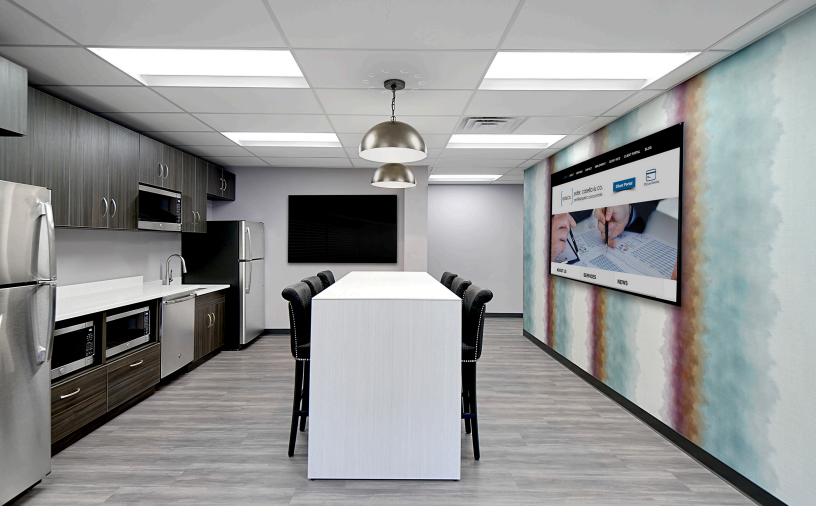
How an office looks shouldn't be a secondary consideration for business owners. It's a primary function because it directly and indirectly influences many aspects of a business's viability, from employee morale to customer retention. A worn-down office sends a bad message to employees, clients, and visitors. A company's office is, ideally, a physical manifestation of its culture and ideals. If it's anything less than that, a company has a problem.

#### **Unneeded Energy Consumption**

Many offices bleed money each month because of inefficient lighting and HVAC systems. An office renovation can help alleviate operating costs. Depending on the specific details, business owners may even find that an office renovation pays for itself by helping them save on utility and energy bills. An eco-friendly office renovation may prove the perfect solution for businesses that value sustainability.

#### **Recruitment & Retention Struggles**

Office design can have a big effect on an employee's decision to stay at a company or leave it for new pastures. Modern professionals spend a lot of time in the office, and if they don't feel comfortable on a base level, they're unlikely to stay for longer than strictly necessary. Low retention rates could be a sign that your office design is letting you down — and driving your best team members out the door.



### **Renovation vs Redesign**

To the untrained professional, "renovation" and "redesign" might seem like interchangeable phrases. However, there's actually a significant difference between the two. Below, we highlight some tips that will help business owners clarify whether an office renovation or an office redesign is the right play for their situation:

#### **Reasons to Opt for an Office Renovation**

- Wanting to make significant changes to work areas and/or specific rooms, such as meeting rooms, conference rooms, etc.
- If a business faces no obstacles acquiring all required permits, and there are no zoning laws that would derail or delay the process, a renovation may be more beneficial than a redesign.
- A suitably-sized budget. Full-scale office renovations will generally cost more than a redesign, reorganization, or office-space optimization.



#### **Reasons to Opt for an Office Redesign**

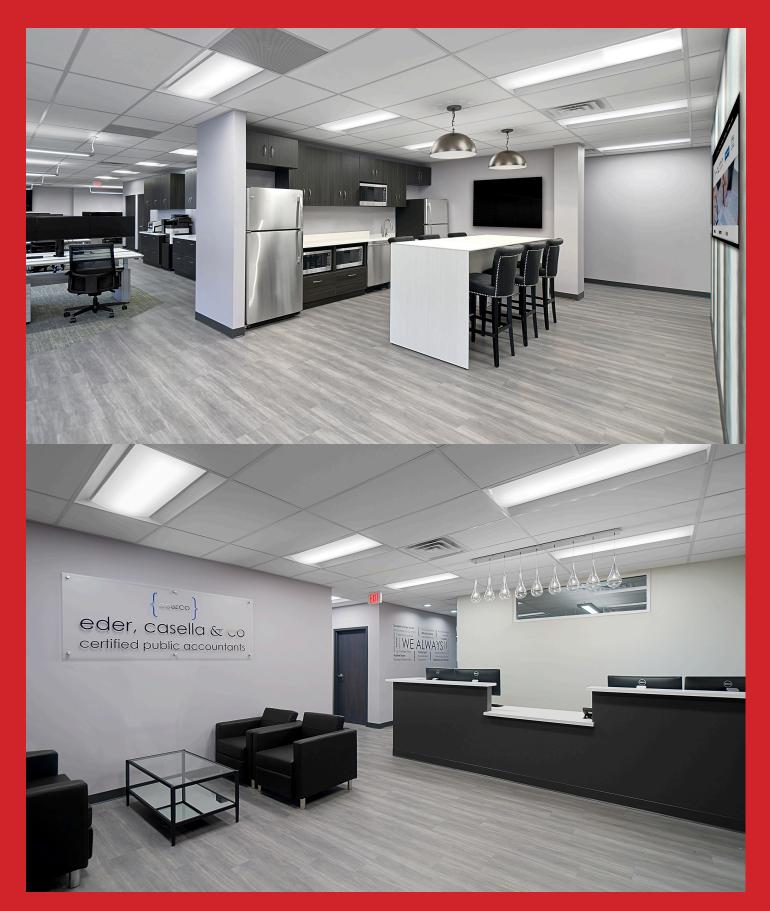
- A business doesn't want to change structural aspects of their business, but would rather focus on smaller aspects such as wall coverings, furniture, flooring, lighting, etc.
- A business wants to make an immediate, transformative impact on the office environment.
- A business has a relatively smaller budget to work with (compared to one that would be sufficient for a larger office renovation).

#### **Other Important Considerations**

Some businesses mistakenly believe that an office renovation requires extensive downtime or causes lasting disruption to employees or customers. However, this is not necessarily the case. Provided that the work is carefully planned (i.e. by expert interior specialists), it is certainly possible to carry out an office renovation with minimal disruption. This also applies to an office redesign, which can be scheduled to take place during off-hours, weekends, etc. Or if work must be scheduled during business hours, it can be executed in stages.

### **Scheduling an Office Renovation**

In business, timing is everything. When a business chooses to schedule an office renovation can have a big influence on how employees perceive it and how positive the changes prove to be.

Therefore, scheduling a renovation must be done carefully and meticulously. Only after researching options to identify all relevant factors will business owners be able to determine the optimal time to schedule an office renovation.

With this in mind, here are some of the factors that business owners need to monitor and prioritize in the office renovation process.

- Planning and design
- Budget frameworks and limits
- Material lead times
- Building permit requirements
- Engineering issues
- Lease stipulations
- Building code standards
- Weather considerations
- Potential tenant disruptions

And then of course, there are potential staff or customer service disruptions that must be taken into consideration. For example, if customer traffic in an office spikes in the spring, then all else being equal, it would be better to schedule an office renovation for the summer or fall. In addition, business owners may consider when they're best able to accommodate their staff in other facilities while an office renovation occurs.

Ultimately, scheduling an office renovation must be based on a realistic and robust schedule; that time frame has to be supported by contingency plans and ready-to-implement workarounds if issues arise, like severe weather for example.



### How to Keep an Office Renovation on Budget

For many business owners, budgetary concerns are top of mind when implementing an office renovation. Fortunately, there are ways professionals can ensure a renovation goes smoothly and, crucially, doesn't go over budget.

#### Work Backwards

As with any big task, keeping a goal in mind at all times will help a team to focus. Plus, by tracking progress against an ultimate goal, business owners can create a realistic time frame for project completion.

#### **Run a Systems Check**

Before a design professional can begin to address issues like the aesthetics, layout, and furniture in an office, they must first examine the most pressing and basic issues in a workspace. A few of these systems include (but aren't limited to) electrical, lighting, HVAC, networking, and security. Do some homework and identify what steps are needed to take before and during the office renovation. This will give professionals a more accurate idea of the costs associated with a renovation.



#### **Be Realistic**

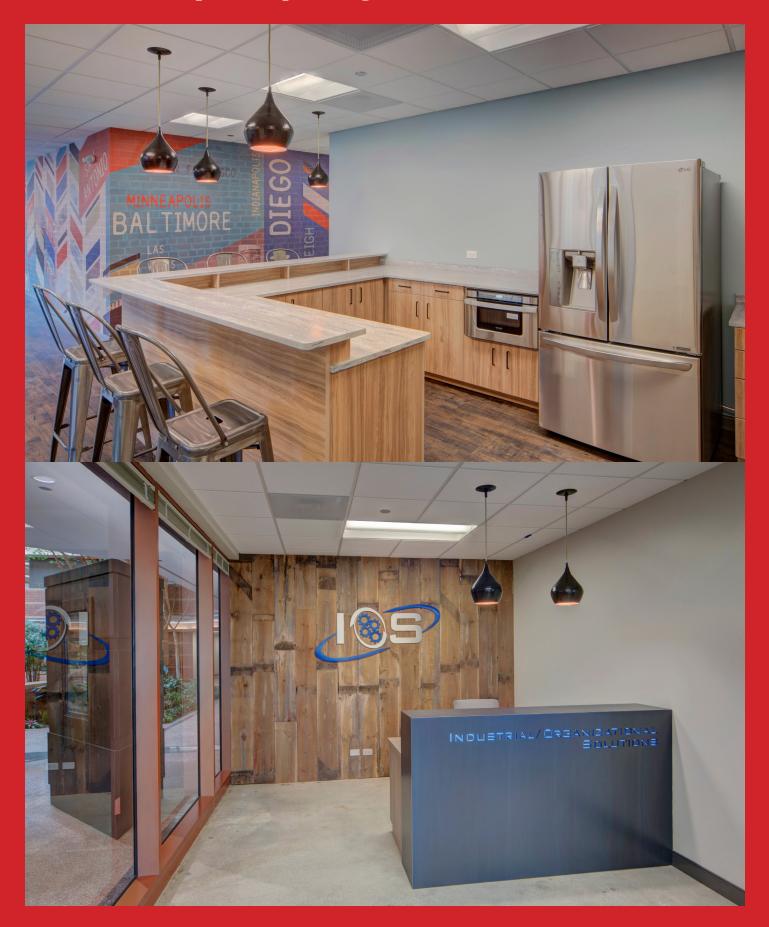
